WHY EVERY BOY SHOULD WRESTLE

1. Wrestling is the most developmental of all scholastic sports.
2. The individual character of wrestling makes victory or defeat a personal responsibility.
3. Wrestling is a contact sport that tests strength and endurance, condition and headwork, developing self-reliance, perserverance and mental alertness.
4. Wrestling is a safe sport. The rules provide that every hold or move which might injure a participant is absolutely prohibited and penalized.
5. Contestants are matched according to weight, enabling competitors of any size to compete in their own class.
6. Wrestling is a natural test of strength, endurance and skill.
7. Wrestling has special appeal because there is continuous movement, constant change of positions and new combinations of holds in every move.
8. The activity conditions the body for a variety of other sports and helps to develop coordination, speed, accuracy and balance while keeping muscles trim and pliable.
9. It is a sport which provides the physical exercise and challenges all individuals need.
10. Team values can be learned as well since winning is impossible unless all members contribute to victory.

ON AND ABOUT AMATEUR WRESTLING

- WRESTLING - is the fastest growing school-boy and collegiate sport
- WRESTLING - under amateur rules during the early part of this century was conducted in a ring, similar to boxing.
- WRESTLING - in the Olympic Games is conducted in two styles - Freestyle, very similar to our regular style of wrestling, and Greco-Roman, which permits no holds below the waist.
- WRESTLING - in the Olympic Games is on mats elevated from the gymnasium floor by risers.
- WRESTLING - in the Olympic Games, next to track, awards the most Gold Medals, 16 in number.
- WRESTLING - in each country usually has a unique variation or style which is usually contested in no other country. Russia has a style called Sambo, Japan, Judo, etc.
- WRESTLING - has an outstanding family in the Perry Clan, Rex Perry and his two sons were all three time NCAA Champs.
- WRESTLING - is one of the safest amateur sports and has a small percentage of accidents and injuries than does football and basketball.
- WRESTLING - received its start in American colleges late in the 1920's and is a new sport compared to basketball or football in the schools.
- WRESTLING - is one of the world's oldest sports and is even mentioned as being popular by Homer.
- WRESTLING - rules are revised annually by a national representative committee in view of constantly improving the sport.
- WRESTLING - in most schools involves more individuals than does basketball and one coach in wrestling is capable of coaching more boys at one time than in most other sports.

INTRODUCTION

The history of wrestling at Newport High School is one of the great Cinderella stories in the Annals of Pennsylvania interscholastic athletics. One would do much searching to find a school whose first fourteen year record can exceed those of Newport. With a total fourteen year log of 166 wins, 20 losses and 1 tie the Buffaloes sport an amazing percentage of eighty-nine per cent. The league record is even more incredible with an overall performance of 94 wins, 2 losses, and 1 tie.

In the fall of 1956 a new football coach arrived in Newport by the name of Robert Craig. Little was known of Coach Craig's background but it was soon learned that he was a legendary five sport performer at Lock Haven State Teachers College. During a three year stint in the U. S. Marines, Mr. Craig finished high in the 1956 Olympic Trials. It is difficult to imagine how a man of such amazing attributes was attracted to this small Perry County Community.

After a disappointing football season of 1 win and 9 losses, Coach Craig turned his attention to the greatest challenge of his career - to begin a wrestling program in a school where the only interpretation of the sport were Saturday night thrillers between Gorilla Monsoon and the Mashed Marvel with the jargon of flying mares and airplane spins.

That first season was merely an intramural program with exhibition meets against Boiling Springs and Green Park in which the Buffaloes split. With the arrival of equipment in February, 1957, a team was organized to enter Section III which included other established teams as Susquehanna Township, Carlisle, Cumberland Valley, Central Dauphin, New Cumberland, Boiling Springs and Big Spring. Among the pioneers on that first organized team were Hayes Kline, 95, Kermit Harry, 103, Carl Campbell, 112, Larry Comp, 127, Larry Fosselman, 133, Earl Heisey, 138, Ed Casner, 154, Tom Miller, 165, and Bill Kimmich, 185. The only victory scored in the tournament came on the efforts of Kermit Harry in the Semi-Finals with a 5-0 decision over Tom Shumberger of Cumberland Valley. Little was it known that this victory would begin a tradition at Newport which still exists - that of winning. Newport emerged from a mere bus-stop on the Harrisburg to Pittsburgh route to a wrestling power house in Central Pa. and a wrestling name state wide.

In the 1957-58 season a dual meet schedule of eleven matches was presented to a freshly organized team which included only two seniors and a number of talented underclassmen. The Buffaloes won their first dual meet ever by stomping West Snyder by a 40-7 score. Newport ran its records to 5-0 before bowing to Cumberland Valley 22-20. The final season survey was 7 wins and 4 losses, an outstanding record for the first full year of competition.

Post-season tournaments brought even more rewards. Four section champs were crowned and one, Clyde Cressler, a freshman 95-pounder, went on to capture the District III title.

Mr. Craig's final year at Newport in 1958-59 showed area fans what was in store for their wrestling team. The Buffaloes rolled up a fantastic second year record of 13-1 with the only loss coming at the hands of a powerful Mechanicsburg team which was on a 70 meet winning streak. Once again post-season tournaments showed the worth of Newport wrestlers. Five section titles were capped and again the 95 pound District III title was in the hands of a Newport wrestler - freshman Vance Miller. Coach Craig departed from the Juniata Valley community with a two-year output of 19 wins, 5 losses and the beginning of a winning tradition.

This winning attitude of the Newport wrestlers could have ended at this point had it not been for the arrival of an extremely adequate replacement. Mr. Kenneth Whisler, a former P.I.A.A. state runner-up while at Hershey High School, a four year navy veteran and a graduate of West Chester State Teachers College arrived on the scene at Newport to assume the controls. Not to be satisfied with good teams, Coach Whisler moved forward to produce great teams. His 1959-60 team sported a 12-1 record losing again only to Mechanicsburg by a close 22-18 margin. Newport again captured 5 section championships and Hayes Kline was crowned 112 pound District Champion. This was the year of the existence of the Blue Mountain League which included seven other schools besides Newport. Susquenita, Big Spring, Boiling Springs, Camp Hill, East Pennsboro, Shippensburg and Northern were the other league members and all had larger enrollment than Newport. However the Buffaloes defeated all seven opponents and captured the first of seven league titles.

In 1960-61 Newport presented a team which may go down in history as its finest. The team opened the season with crushing shutout victories over West Snyder and Chief Logan by 52-0 and 47-0 verdicts. The closing victories were also lopsided shutouts, 52-0 over East Pennsboro and a 57-0 romp of Northern. Post season tournaments held more laurels in store. Six section championships were captured and an incredible three District titles were garnered by Newport matmen. Clyde Neidigh, Clyde Cressler and Jim Heisey showed Newport's class to the entire district. Two weeks later Neidigh and Cressler made the first appearance of any Newport grapplers to the P.I.A.A. State Championships at University Park. Although they dropped Semi-final decisions to the eventual champs, Newport was now known state wide.

Success and disappointment filled the 1961-62 season. Newport once again presented a fine team but lost two dual meets both by one point margins. With no attempt to rationalize but merely by stating facts both decisions could have been reversed. In the 22-21 loss to Cedar Cliff Newport met disaster in the 120 pound match when Gary Snyder was defeating his opponent by a 5-0 score in the third period when he suffered a slight concussion and was forced to default. This was an eight point reversal. In the 24-23 defeat by Mechanicsburg, veteran 138 pounder, Jim Kipp, reported that morning he would be unable to compete because of a shoulder injury. His replacement, an inexperienced Ken Rhoades, was no match for Mechanicsburg's Carl Adams, as he was pinned in the quick time of 28 seconds. It is quite speculative that a healthy Kipp could have gone the distance thus slicing of three points from the wildcats tally. Also a disappointment was for the first time in its short history. Newport had an absence of District Champs, although Vance Miller and Jim Campbell were runnersup.

A determined team set forth in 1962-63 to be the first to go undefeated. However their dreams were shattered in the fourth match of the season with a 23-14 defeat at the hands of Cedar Cliff. Later that season the Buffaloes triumphed over Mechanicsburg for the first time after four consecutive losses. The close of the season showed a 13-1 record and once again a 7-0 league record. The team brought forward a freshman 95 pound star in the name of Sherm Hostler who would become a legendary performer during his tenure as a Newport matman. Five section champs were produced and Hostler and Steve Peters emerged as District III champions. Both moved on and captured Regional crowns and journeyed to the State Championships. After winning their semi-final bouts, Sherm and Steve advanced Newport wrestling one step further by becoming the first representatives to compete in the finals. Although both dropped hard fought decisions, Newport was the only team in the state with two finalists. If Pennsylvania was like many other states in helping team score, Newport would have emerged as State Champions for that year.

In the fall of 1963 prospects for a great team were diminished when six returning lettermen decided not to compete. This left a nucleus of only five veterans. The remainder of the team had to be filled by untested J.V.'s. But fate was on the side of the Buffaloes. As the season wore on the novices became more experienced and the team by February, 1964 had totaled 14 victories to become the first undefeated team in the seven-year history. Once again the Blue Mountain League Title was in the hands of the Buffaloes. Biglerville had entered the league thus Newport had another victim to finish the season with 8-0 league record and brought the overall total to 36-0. Post-season tournaments brought more thrills for area fans. Six section championships were added and three moved into the District III Finals. Sherm Hostler continued his winning ways by capturing the 103 title but the joy turned to sorrow when Steve Peters, the defending District Champion and a four-year competitor, was upset by Marty Gruver, of Central Dauphin East by a score of 5-4. Dave Jones also dropped his match to highly talented Randy Kahler.

Hostler continued his winning efforts by capturing his second regional title and advanced into the P.I.A.A. state final. This time not to be denied, Sherm came back after a 5-0 deficit to defeat Terry Magoon of Erie Strong Vincent by an 11-5 outcome. Thus Sherm became the first state champion for Newport and remains the only state titlest to the present.

After the highly successful season, Coach Whisler decided to move on to his present position at Manheim Township High School after amassing a record of 65-5. Newport had won its last 24 matches without a defeat.

Throughout the summer of 1964 Newport fans were asking "Who would be the next Coach? Would the success of the Buffaloes be continued?" Finally the announcement was made to the hiring of a recent Lock Haven graduate, Alan Kline. He had wrestled little varsity at Lock Haven, but only the knowledgeable wrestling fans knew why. It happens that the Bald Eagles had several National Champs which caused Mr. Kline to be a second stringer but with no disgrace. However Coach Kline

was not a second-string coach. He took control of the Buffaloes and in 1964-65 had a 12-1-1 record. This was a year of transition. The Buffaloes only defeat at the hands of Mechanicsburg snapped a 30 match winning streak. A 21-21 tie with Big Spring ended a league streak of 44 victories. However the Buffaloes for the sixth consecutive years were the Blue Mountain League Champs. Mike Shull and Chuck Blattenberger both won their second sectional title and Blattenberger moved to the District III finals before suffering defeat.

Newport moved into the 1965-66 season with the knowledge that this was destined to be their last in the Blue Mountain League in which the Buffaloes had had great success. Senior Sherm Hostler was determined once again to be a statewide figure after a disappointing season as a junior. With his leadership the Buffaloes totalled a 13-1 record and for seventh and last year grabbed the Blue Mountain League Title. Newport retired from the league with a 52-0-1 record. For their outstanding record at this time, the team was honored by the Pennsylvania House of Representatives. A Resolution was drawn up and given to each team member, the administration, and Coach Kline. The brilliant overall record of the Buffaloes now stands at 107-12-1. Four section champs emerged and Sherm Hostler moved through the Districts and Regionals once again into the P.I.A.A. State Finals. There he met for the second time with defeat by a Shamokin opponent as he was pinned by Harry Winehofer in a time of 3:19. However Sherm concluded his fabulous career with a 79-6 mark. He was only three-time state finalist since Mike Johnson grabbed four championships from 1958-61.

In 1966-67 Newport completed a decade of wrestling. Mike Shull was the only remaining member of the 1963-64 undefeated team. He was determined to lead the Buffaloes to another undefeated mark. Newport was now in a new league, the Tri-Valley, with some new opponents. Only twelve dual meets were scheduled but the Buffaloes had little trouble capturing the full dozen and added the Tri-Valley league trophy to those of the Blue Mountain League. Many people would argue that this was the best Newport team ever, no one can really tell. This marked the second time to go undefeated for Newport and Coach Kline's first. Since many of the other league members were in District VI and District IV, the question arose, "Where would Newport go for sections?" Finally District III assigned the Buffaloes to the tough Section I of the Harrisburg Area which included such powerhouses as Lower Dauphin, Mechanicsburg and Cumberland Valley. Newport emerged with two sectional champs, Hodge Little and Charlie Smith. Mike Shull dropped a hard-fought 1-0 decision to returning state-runnerup Chris Black of Susquehanna Township. Hodge continued his winning ways by taking the District Title before bowing in the regional finals.

The first match of the 1967-68 season spelled the worst defeat ever suffered by the Buffaloes. The Colts of Cedar Cliff trounced the local favorites by a 42-12 count. Later that season first league defeat ever was administered by Lewistown. This broke a streak of 67 league matches without a defeat. However the team came back to complete the season

with a 12-2 record and tied for the league Championship. A new star emerged in the name of Bruce Jones. He along with Hodge Little and Lee Dobyms captured section titles and advanced into the District finals. There Dobyms upset defending Champ Chris Black. Little was overwhelmed by Bill Luckenbaugh of West York and Jones defeated Tritch of Lower Dauphin to give Newport two district champs for the first time since 1963. Dobyms bowed in the Regional finals but Jones continued into the State Semi-finals before being outpointed by Jim Fleming of Mt. Lebanon.

With two district champs returning, the 1968-69 season was viewed with optimism. However Cedar Cliff again stopped the hopes short with a 27-14 defeat. But the Buffaloes regrouped and finished the season with thirteen consecutive victories to close with 13-1 mark and again had the Tri-Valley League trophy on its shelf. Dobyms and Jones again reached the District III finals but here they parted. Lee dropped a close 8-7 decision to Dave Yohn of Manheim Central. Bruce capped his second District title and a week later added his second regional crown. After a victory in the state semi-finals he became the fifth and last Newport wrestler to reach the finals. There Bruce bowed in a thrilling 7-4 defeat at the hands of Bob Sacavage of Mount Carmel.

A young squad of wrestlers reported for the 1969-70 season. The varsity team which emerged contained only three seniors. This young team defeated the traditional nemesis Cedar Cliff and finished second to Manheim Central in the Boiling Springs Tournament. After posting a 4-0 mark disaster struck in January. Inexperience took its toll as the Buffaloes suffered its second league defeat, this time at the hands of Chief Logan which cost the Newporters the league trophy after ten consecutive years as champions. Two matches later Mechanicsburg defeated the Buffaloes for the first time in four years. Then a month later partly due to an injury to star 95-pounder Brooks Smith, Newport suffered its most embarrassing defeat by dropping a 28-18 verdict to her Perry rival Susquenita. With an 11-3 record it appeared to be a poor season for the Buffaloes. However a new Sectional arrangement of independent schools gave Newport seven sectional champs and one of these, Darry Campbell, continued his winning ways by taking the District III title and advanced into the state Semi-finals where he dropped a heart-breaking decision to Tiny Dugan of German Township.

Rounding out fourteen years of wrestling the 1970-71 team was again an exciting team to watch. Upsets contributed to two dual meet losses to Cedar Cliff and Mechanicsburg but with a 12-2 record the team was rated in the top five in the Harrisburg Area. Once again the Buffaloes crowned seven section champs. Darry Campbell once again moved into the District Finals but was denied a second crown with a controversial defeat at the hands of Stan Smith of Boiling Springs. This closed out the season and brought Coach Kline's record to a respectable 84-10-1.

As the previous paragraphs have indicated, Newport has had an extremely successful fourteen years of wrestling. One must ask why this has been possible. A school with only four hundred students in grades 9-12 to have a winning percentage of 89 per cent is phenomenal. Many factors have contributed to this overwhelming success. First, Newport has been blessed with three outstanding coaches. A school may have a world of talent but without the proper guidance and instruction this talent will go unnoticed. To compliment the excellent coaching, Newport has had an abundance of raw talent. Thus a winning combination has been produced. The socio-economical standard of Newport has helped in producing this winning attitude. Students are endowed with more physical strength in this rural area than those of a suburban district. In addition the economic standard under which Newport students live makes the athlete excel to be noticed rather than gaining recognition through material possessions.

Wrestling at Newport has become a way of life for its participants. The discipline gained through the sport provides a guidance for life. Through wrestling many Newport students such as Dave Jones, Steve Peters, Mike Smith, Clyde Neidigh, Clyde Cressler, Gene Hale, Chuck Blattenberger, and Mike Shull have sought to continue their education and to continue their participation in the sport. Not all became college stars, but wrestling provided the drive to enter college and in the process they obtained an education.

Newport presently has two former matmen on college varsities, Paul Britcher is beginning his third year as heavyweight at Clarion State College. In the most dramatic example of a wrestling attitude, Vance Miller at age 26 began his college studies last year at Millersville State College. Vance is seeking a college education but the underlying drive is to continue his wrestling participation.

In the coaching ranks throughout District III, ex-Newport grapplers are found in head coaching positions. Examples are Earl Heisey, Halifax; Gene Hale, Garden Spot; Ned Sault, Boiling Springs; Al Jensen, Hamburg, and Clyde Neidigh at James Buchanan. Although he never competed as a Newport wrestler, Dave Baer has proved himself a sincere student of the sport as the successful head coach of Susquenita for the past six years. In addition to head coaches, Steve Peters, Mike Shull, Mike Smith, Chuch Blattenberger, and Marlin Hetrick are found as assistant coaches in excellent wrestling programs.

Others not in the coaching ranks or no longer competitors remain active as officials. Luther Fleisher and Jerry Robinson can be found as active District III Officials.

No athletic programs can be successful without the support of the local fans. Newport can truly boast of a large and dedicated following of spectators. Thus it is a total community effort - participants, coaches, and fans.

This year should prove that the winning tradition will once again exist at Newport. A talented group of veteran grapplers will once again delight the many fans.

What about the future? Well this is a question that is difficult to answer. Maybe we should follow the advice of the well-known lyrics--"The future is not ours to see; what will be, will be."

COACHES CORNER

Coaching at Newport for the last 7 years has been a very gratifying experience for me. When I came here in 1964, I had much apprehension and excitement as to what I would find. The year before, the team had gone undefeated for the first time in their short, but impressive career. Gone from that team were many good wrestlers, all of whom had scored an impressive number of team points. A new coach was to step in and guide the team in the footsteps of two outstanding coaches. Wrestlers as well as fans watched and waited to see how the new coach would react to the situation. Many people thought certain things should be done a certain way, but hardest of all was letting everyone know the new coach was his own person and not going along with what had been the format in years past. Personalities being what they are and no two people reacting the same way, the coach made headway into the great Newport wrestling tradition.

That first year was a coaching career in itself. Not knowing the boys and their weights, being unfamiliar with the opposition, and listening to everyone who seemed interested (and there were many) perhaps made the season a little confusing. Nevertheless, we pushed forward into an undefeated Blue Mountain League Championship and an overall record of 12-1-1. Possibly even more frightening was the fact that Newport had a returning state champion on your first team you ever coached. Needless to say this helped in many ways, but made an uneasy situation at times.

After surviving that year and looking ahead to coming seasons, I still felt the pressure of winning, because, by now, Newport had a record of 94-12-1, and no one wanted to be on the team which would see that record nose dive. This factor, and possibly the pride of the coaches, wrestlers, and fans helped to drive everyone on to greater efforts.

In retrospect, how could any loyal fan forget the exciting matches with Cedar Cliff, a school which graduates in one year more students than Newport has in the senior high school? Then there were really see-saw matches such as those with Mechanicsburg, but none stand out as much as the 1969-70 match with Big Spring. The Bulldogs were undefeated and really rolling over everyone, even teams that had beaten the Buffaloes earlier that year. Their fans were many, coming in buses, cars, and who knows what else. This was the year the Bulldogs were finally supposed to beat Newport. On paper, Big Spring had a tremendous edge, even loyal Newport fans were doubtful of any success, with just cause. But as fate would have it, the bulldogs were just no match for the fired-up Buffaloes that night and Newport won by a score of 26-23.

That one question keeps popping up. "How long can this unbelievable record keep up? When will there be a bad year, or even an average one?" No one can answer this question, but one thing is for sure, as long as there is an all out effort by coaches and wrestlers with seemingly tireless dedication to the sport, there will be greatness. As any coach knows, you are only as good as your "material." If the boys are not there, or choose not to participate for some reason, then there may be a decline.

Perhaps the greatest reward of coaching at Newport has been the association with such an overwhelming number of truly great kids. When you see what goes into making an impressive record in any sport, you realize the magnitude of dedication and hard work. To be great in anything in life, you must make sacrifices, and a good wrestler makes more than anyone else. Practices being extremely strenuous, dieting to make a certain weight, not being able to run around after school with the gang, and making more little sacrifices; all these go into making a boy the type of athlete of which a parent or school can be proud. It is this dedication that sets apart the truly great from the so-called "average" wrestler. Watching each one of "your boys" graduating and wondering how you will ever replace him is always going to be a big part of coaching; having "heart to heart talks," laying it on the line, using strategy to win, "psyching up" a team, and teaching fundamentals are also various aspects that are encountered.

I also think I am quite lucky to have the opportunity to take boys to the state finals. Many coaches work for a career and never get the opportunity. When you consider that wrestling is growing faster in Pennsylvania than in any other state in the nation and has the most schools involved with the sport, it makes you feel quite fortunate. Out of 24,000 school boy wrestlers in Pennsylvania, only forty-eight reach the coveted state finals. Newport has had the opportunity to be represented there with nine boys, one going three times. The experience a boy and the coaches receive from this honor is uncomparable to anything else in the sport.

One thing that Newport has gained through the years is the reputation of having an outstanding wrestling team. When traveling throughout the state and being confronted with the question, "Where are you from?" you feel a sense of pride emit forth when their reply is "Oh, that's the town with the good wrestling teams!" To over-hear a group of young boys talking about their opponents and stating theirs is from Newport, "I'll probably get beat," makes me realize that all this hard work is not going unnoticed. Many difficult and tiring efforts are put forth into a good wrestling program. Boys are not just good without help from all coaches, parents, and teammates. The constant yelling, assistance, and encouragement all go into making this one of the most wholesome sports of all time.

I cannot agree with the statement, "Losing builds character." All you have to do is watch a bunch of "losers" and see what "fun" they are having. At the same time nothing is being learned. Confidence is possibly the key to sports' achievement. If you are a winner, it is because you believe you can do it. Confidence is something only winning can help. I've watched boys who both win and lose and always the difference seemed to be that confidence factor. At Newport we try to build a sense of pride and confidence into our boys. We do this by winning.

Finally, I would like to thank some people for their assistance and help through the years. People like Don Troutman, Paul Jones, and Mike Smith have been tremendous assets to our wrestling program. There were, and are, others who in some way or another have been of great value to our teams, so I say thank you. Even in making this yearbook a possibility, much hard work was done by Bil Cressler, a member of our present team and last of a great wrestling family, and Foster Brinser and Mrs. Doris Schmid also assisted in the final realization of this yearbook. Finally, a big thanks to all the wrestlers for creating all these fine records which are a source of pride in our school and community.
